## Recommended Native Butterfly Nectar Plants

### Trees & Shrubs:

Basswood (*Tilia americana*)  
Buttonbush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*)  
New Jersey tea (*Ceanothus americanus*)  
Redbud tree (*Cercis canadensis*)  
Sumacs (*Rhus spp.*)  
Sweet Pepper Bush (*Clethra spp.*)  
Virginia Fringe Tree (*Chionanthus virginica*)

### Perennials & Annuals:

\*Asters (*Aster spp.*)  
\*Beebalm (*Monarda fistulosa*)  
\*Blazing star/Gay Feather (*Liatris spicata*, *L. grammifolia*, *L. squarrosa*)  
\*Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*)  
\*Common Milkweed (*Asclepias syriaca*)  
\*Coreopsis (*Coreopsis spp.*)  
\*Joe-Pye-Weed (*Eupatorium maculatum*)  
\*Pickerelweed (*Pontederia cordata*)  
\*Verbena (*Verbena spp.*)  
\*Viper's Bugloss (*Echium vulgare*)  
\*Wild Blue Phlox (*Phlox divaricata*)

Azaleas (*Rhododendron atlantica*, *R. austrinum*, *R. serrulatum*)

Black-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia fulgida*, *R. lanceolata*)

Blue Mistflower (*Eupatorium coelestinum*)

Boneset (*Eupatorium perfoliatum*)

Bouncing Bet (*Saponaria officinalis*)

Goldenrods (*Solidago spp.*)

Ironweed (*Vernonia spp.*)

Purple Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*)

Spotted Knapweed (*Centaurea maculosa*)

Swamp Milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*)

Verbena (*Verbena spp.*)

Wild Clovers (*Trifolium carolinianum*, *T. reflexum*, *T. virginicum*)

### Notes:

- ✿ Some cultivars of native plants may be selected for size of bloom or other factors that may make them less attractive to butterflies than the original wild plant.
- ✿ Always use natives that have been propagated from wild stock that has not been poached from the wild
- ✿ Natives need to be matched to the correct site or they are NOT low maintenance!!
