

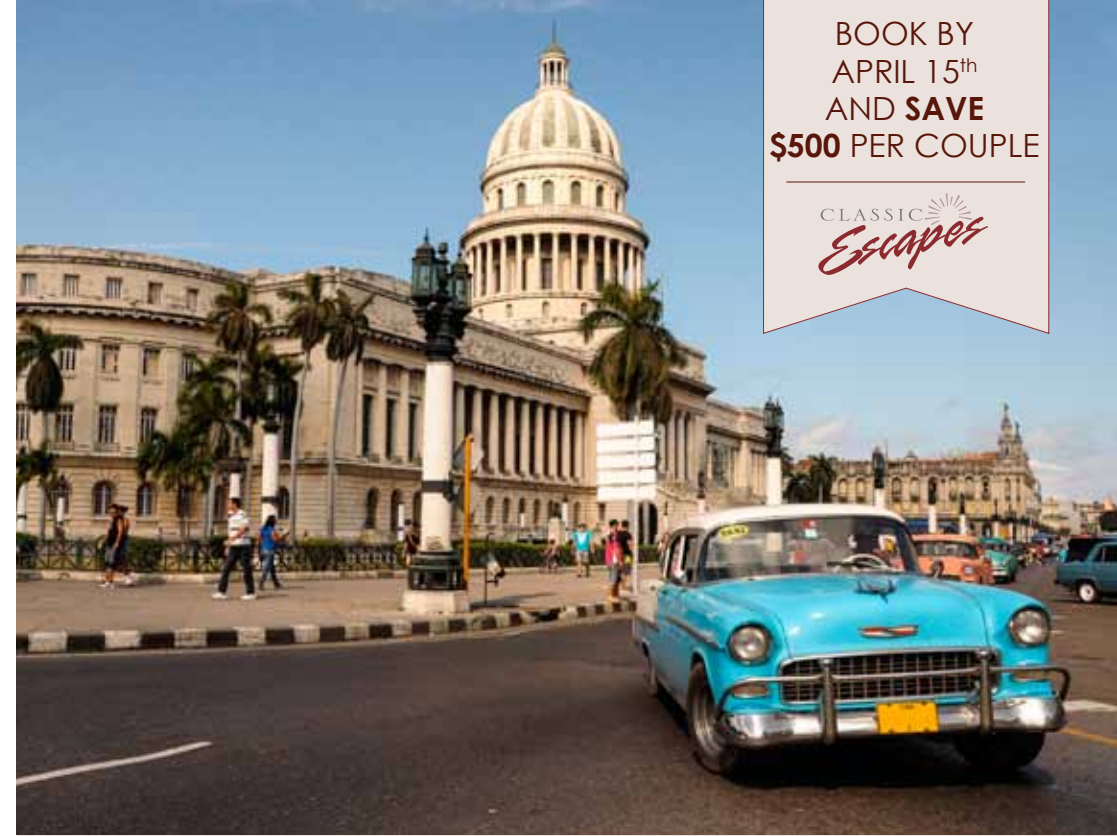

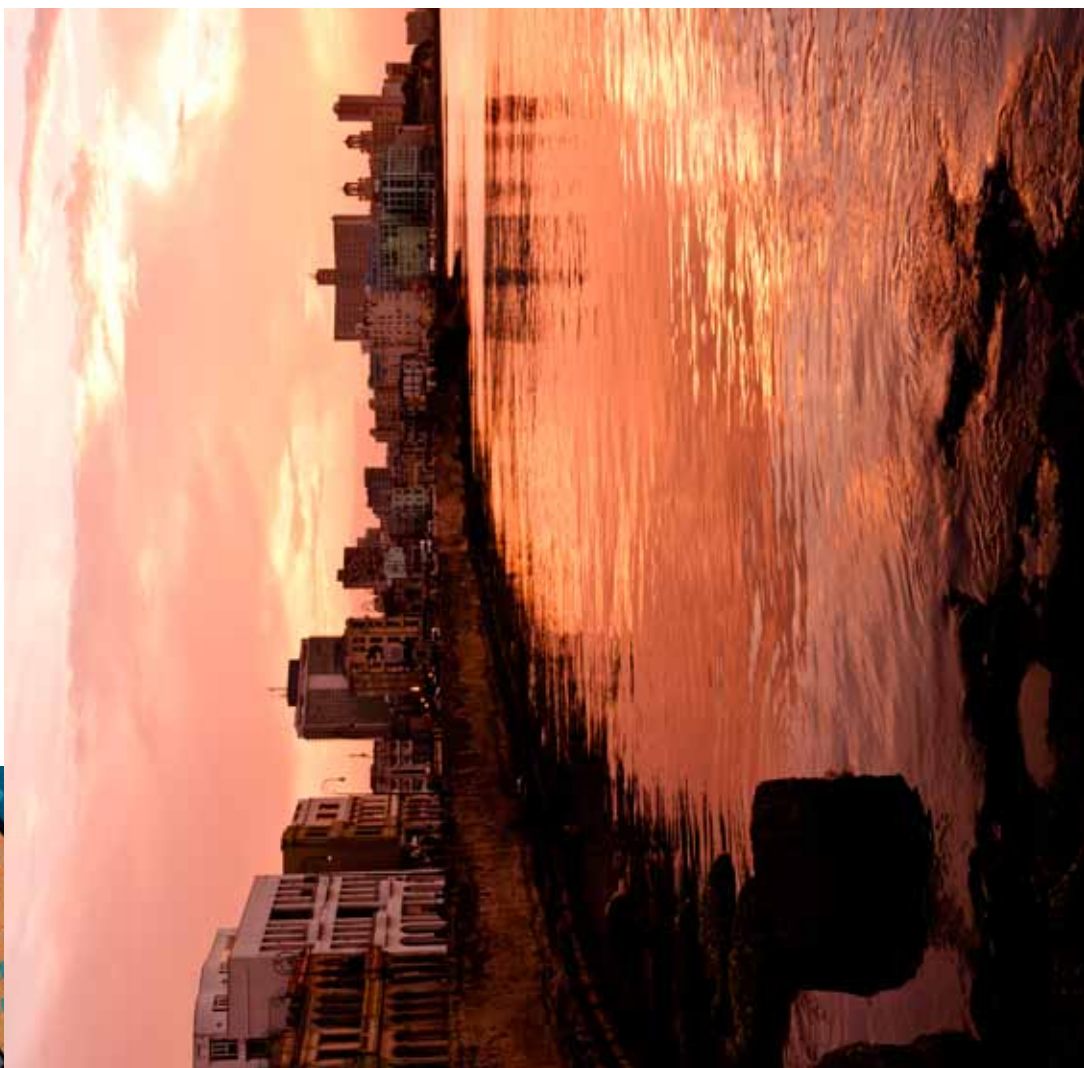

YOUR ITINERARY

DAY 1 ~ CHARLOTTE/MIAMI **MIAMI MARRIOTT. (D)**
 Arrive in Miami today and meet with the rest of the group at your hotel. Get to know your fellow travelers tonight over dinner, and get any last-minute instructions and travel documents on your upcoming adventure to Cuba.

DAY 2 ~ MIAMI/HAVANA **HOTEL SARATOGA. (L,D)**
 Land in Jose Marti International airport and transfer to your hotel while driving through historic Havana. Take an elevator ride to the top of a 357-foot tall tower, part of the Jose Marti memorial, for a panoramic view of Havana. After lunch, take a stroll through old Havana with a local historian, replete with magnificent colonial architecture. Visit a local graphic arts studio and interact with local artists.

DAY 3 ~ HAVANA **HOTEL SARATOGA. (B,L,D)**
 Your morning starts with a visit to the unique Cuban National Zoo for a safari experience where many animals live in habitats that mimic their native environment. Next, experience the Botanical Gardens of Havana with its considerable collection of indigenous palms and tropical plants, with a naturalist and garden staff. Gain an insight into conservation efforts focused on important native species. After lunch in a nearby restaurant, visit a local community development project, called Muraleando. Interact with the director, staff and residents, while learning about the impact this project has had on the community

DAY 4 ~ HAVANA **HOTEL SARATOGA. (B,L,D)**
 Following breakfast at your hotel, visit a local day care center to interact with students and nuns to learn about the various projects undertaken by the facility. Stop in at the Divino Paladar at Finca Yoandra, an organic urban farm. Meet with the owners and see how the food is prepared in the on-site restaurant. Visit the National Aquarium in Havana, for a view into the various coastal regions of Cuba. Afterward visit with the Cuban Institute of Music and delve into the rich cultural history of this island's musical heritage.

DAY 5 ~ HAVANA/CIENEGA DE ZAPATA/CIENFUEGOS **HOTEL LA RONDA. (B,L,D)**
 Today's drive takes you southeast of Havana to Boca de Guama where the principal activity is the Criadero de Crocodilos, a huge crocodile farm. Interact with breeders and scientists of the research facility and learn about this breeding facility for the Rhombifier (the endangered Cuban Crocodile) and the Acutus (the threatened American Crocodile). Next, walk through Cienega de Zapata Natural Reserve, the largest swamp in the Caribbean area which is on the UNESCO Biosphere Reserve list, to experience one of the most important ecosystems in Cuba and learn about park conservation efforts from CITMA (Ministerio de Ciencia Tecnologia y Medio Ambiente) staff. Visit the Bay of Pigs site of the annual migration of millions of land crabs on your way to Cienfuegos, in the Cuban highlands, known for its many domed buildings.

DAY 6 ~ CIENFUEGOS/TRINIDAD **HOTEL LA RONDA. (B,L,D)**
 Head to El Cubano Park in the Escambray Mountain range for hiking and a visit with a local farmer. Continue on to Trinidad and Casa del Alfarero, where Chichi Santander and his family have been making pottery of national renown for generations. Later on journey to Trinidad's Historical Center, a UNESCO World Heritage site, for a feast of 18th and 19th Century architecture around Plaza Mayor and walk around Trinidad to visit the small artist owned galleries that help give the town its charm.

DAY 7 ~ CIENFUEGOS/SANTA CLARA **HOTEL IBEROSTAR ENSENACHOS. (B,L,D)**
 Drive to Delfinario de Cienfuegos and its dolphin preservation facility for an insightful discussion with resident biologists. Afterward, drive to the very center of Cuba: Santa Clara City. Here, meet with mature Cubans at a center for the elderly for a chance to engage in life conversations over a mean game of dominoes. Travel onward to Remedios with its cobbled streets and colonial era buildings visiting small rural farms along the way. Remedios is a national treasure and celebrates 500 years of history in 2014, having been founded in 1514. Afterward, depart for the Cayo Encenachos, an island located north of Cuba in the Jardines del Rey archipelago.

DAY 8 ~ REMEDIOS/CAIBARIEN **HOTEL IBEROSTAR ENSENACHOS. (B,L,D)**
 Start your day with a drive to the fishing town of Caibarién the Proyecto de Arte Por la Costa to meet with local artists Madelín Perez Noa and her husband, Leo in their studio (duties permitting.) Next, meet the children of the municipal band and their director, for a discussion about the organization and its history in the local Cuban community. Drive to an old sugar mill to learn about how the sugar industry has changed over the last 50 years. Head back to Remedios for a visit with a local priest and observe how he enriches his community through prayer, activities, sports and hobbies, before returning to Cayo Encenachos in time for a farewell dinner.

DAY 9 ~ SANTA CLARA/MIAMI/CHARLOTTE **MIAMI MARRIOTT HOTEL. (B, Meals Aloft)**
 Today you visit the Che Memorial to complete your Cuba travel. Board your flight home, carrying with you many fond memories of your Cuban adventure.

RATES: Rates are based on the minimum number of guests outlined in this document, plus airfare costs, currency exchange rates and other factors and are subject to change. Though it is rare for Classic Escapes to make a price adjustment after promotion of an itinerary, we do reserve the right to assess a surcharge if the minimum is not met, or if increases are forced upon us by airlines or other partners or because of changes in currency exchange rates.
